Working as a member of this dynamic team, you will apply your experience, analytical and problem-solving skills and knowledge in airport compliance, and Transport Canada regulatory requirements to the safe operation of the Remote Northern Airports.

- You have strong organizational skills to plan, organize and monitor own work (i.e., determining work priorities and setting individual assignments).
- You have the ability to interpret legislative and regulatory requirements and to advise colleagues, managers and stakeholders as appropriate.
