

ON-SCENE CONTROLLER

COURSE LENGTH: 2 DAYS

COURSE OBJECTIVE

Participants will learn how to effectively fulfill the role of On-Scene Controller (OSC) or Incident Commander at an emergency site, while meeting applicable legislation including the Canadian Aviation Regulations (CARs).

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Understand the CARs as it pertains to the requirements of the OSC
- Understand the importance of leadership with the OSC
- Learn how the OSC works within the unified command structure
- Develop multiple strategies to become an efficient and skillful note taker
- Learn techniques as to how to complete an efficient scene/victim assessment

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The purpose of an On-Scene Controller is three-fold; protection of life, protection of property and protection of environment. This two-day course provides education for those who, in the event of an incident, will be required to take on the role of On-Scene Controller or Incident Commander. Participants in the course will learn essential information through both classroom presentations and hands-on exercises, covering a wide range of subjects set out in CARs requirements under Section 302.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

This course is designed for anyone in an organization that might be tasked with being the first on the scene of an incident at an airport and would be required to be the OSC or Incident Commander; this includes airport operations directors, managers and staff.
